


Training Long-term Carers



For the elderly who live in remote areas, there could hardly have any accessibility to healthcare and long-term carers. In view of this, the Quixotic Implement Foundation of PCH has assisted the Ministry of Health and Welfare to train long-term carers for aborigines and people living in distant places.

Mrs. Lin, who has participated in this project for a couple of years, stated that the importance lies in finding the right person and putting him or her in the right position. However, it is not easy to find the right person, since we need to make sure that he persists in taking the training. The course should cater to the needs and the reactions of the students as well. Moreover, we need to hire teachers and specialists who are able to grasp the latest policy and social development, in order to ensure a positive learning outcome.

The Quixotic Implement Foundation provides a platform between the new carers and specialists to exchange their experience and to engage in dialogues. We aim to train more qualified long-term carers to guarantee the elderly the quality of life and dignity.
